What is a PAC?

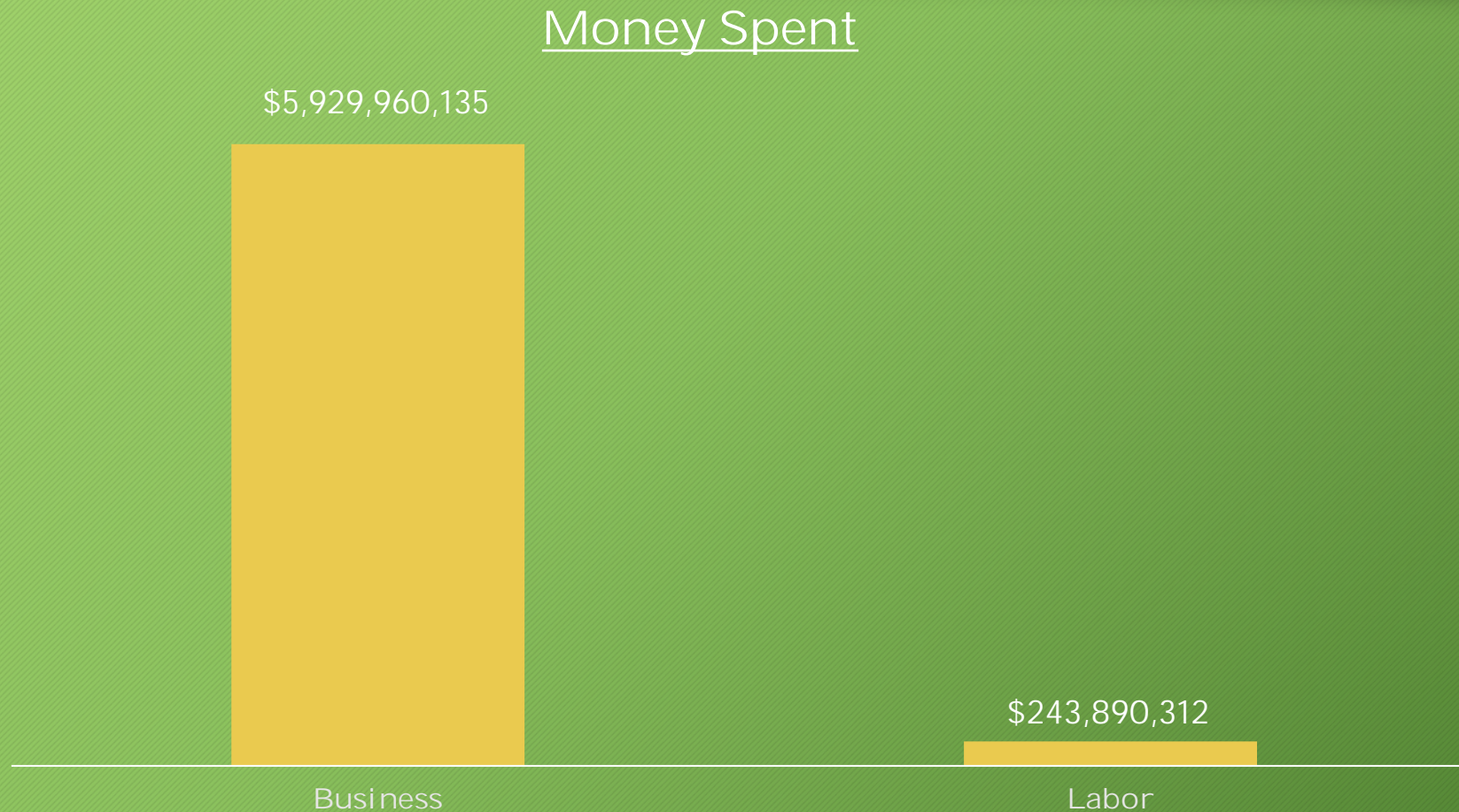
- A political action committee (PAC) is an organization that functions as a liaison between elected federal legislators and the electorate.
- PACs are formed by corporations, associations and labor unions to gain representation on Capitol Hill by financially supporting candidates.
- PACs solicit *voluntary* contributions from individuals with common interest to advance a political process.
- PACs are *nonpartisan* entities whose primary concern is to elect qualified candidates regardless of party affiliation.

Important Reminder!



- Under federal law, union dues cannot be used for partisan political activity.
- Donations to the PASS PAC are strictly voluntary.

2020 Election Spending: Corporations Outspent Labor Nearly 25 to 1



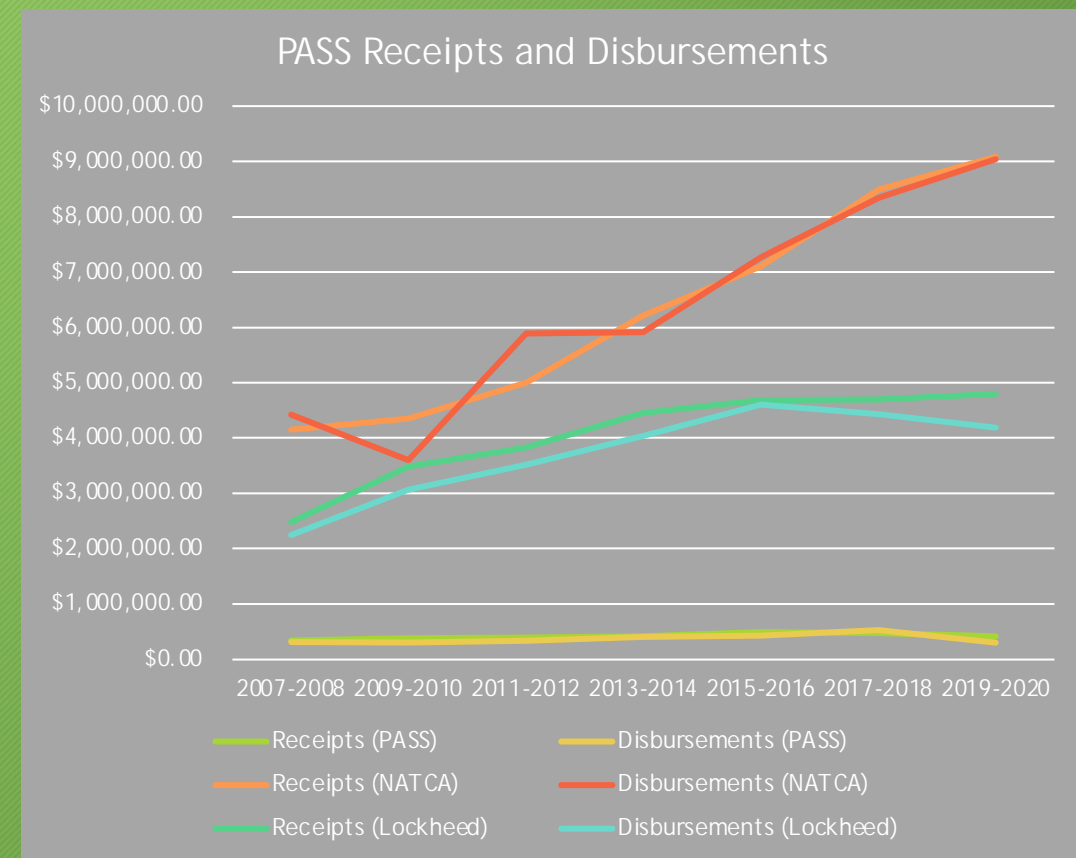
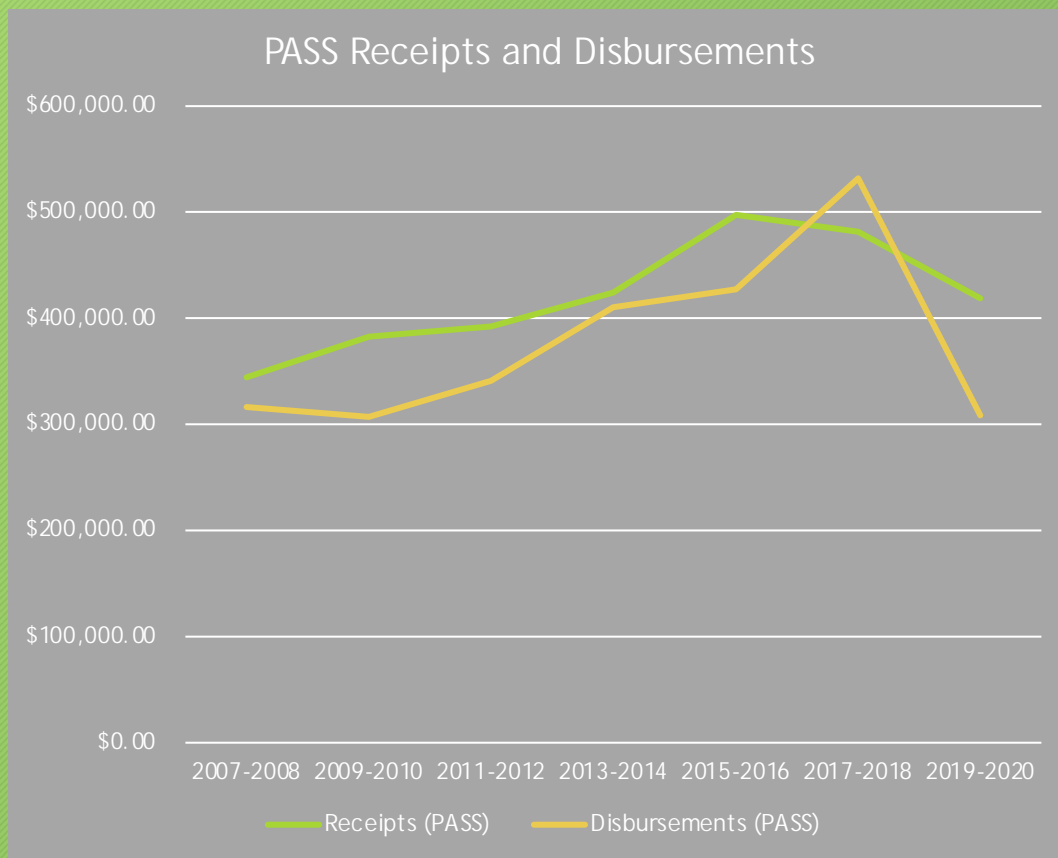
PASS PAC Contributions 2010–2021
