#### What is a PAC?

- A political action committee (PAC) is an organization that functions as a liaison between elected federal legislators and the electorate.
- PACs are formed by corporations, associations and labor unions to gain representation on Capitol Hill by financially supporting candidates.
- PACs solicit *voluntary* contributions from individuals with common interest to advance a political process.
- PACs are *nonpartisan* entities whose primary concern is to elect qualified candidates regardless of party affiliation.





Under federal law, union dues cannot be used for partisan political activity.

Donations to the PASS PAC are strictly voluntary.


#### PASS PAC Contributions 2010–2021




# PASS PAC Receipts 2010 - 2021
